Proposition 1E

- Manage storm water runoff to reduce flood damages- Flood Focus
- Multiple benefits include;
 - Groundwater Recharge
 - Water Quality Improvement
 - Ecosystem benefits and restoration
 - Reduction of in-stream erosion and sedimentation
- OWOW projects eligible to compete
- SAWPA workshop February 3, 2011 from 1:30 to 3:00 p.m.

Proposition 1E

- \$212,000,000 allocated
- \$30 M per project cap with 50% cost share
- Competitive process with applications due April 15
- Lessons Learned From Prop 84
 - Application is detailed and time consuming
 - Economic Analysis is difficult for many applicants
