Call to Order/Introductions

The CEQA Scoping Meeting for Proposed Basin Plan Amendment to Update Certain Elements of the Salt and Nitrogen Management Plan for the Santa Ana Region called to order at 1:04 p.m. at the Santa Ana Watershed Project Authority office located at 11615 Sterling Avenue, Riverside, California.

Project Description

Cindy Li provided the Executive Summary listing ten topics the staff report will cover. She also provided an action list showing the steps of the basin planning process:

- Establish the need for the amendment
- Research
- Hold CEQA Scoping meeting
- Develop draft amendment and draft staff report
- Obtain scientific peer review
- Revise amendment and staff report
- Notice hearing
- Hold adoption hearing and finalize amendment and staff report
- Transmit two copies of indexed, paginated administrative record to SWRCB

Ms. Li presented and reviewed the CEQA Checklist Form noting that the checklist stated mostly “no impact”. She indicated the one item that is checked “less than significant impact” is on page 10 of 11 and asks “Would the project or result in the construction of new water or

wastewater treatment facilities or expansion of existing facilities, the construction of which could cause significant environmental effects? This impact would have to be considered because it involves the City of Riverside and possibly the City of Beaumont.

Management zone boundary maps were presented and Ms. Li stated one of the City of Corona ponds is located within the Prado Basin Management Zone so the treated water would have to meet the water quality objective. She said the City of Corona is moving to tertiary treatment. Review of the boundaries ensued and discussion followed.
