



The Steering Committee Meeting was called to order at 3:20 p.m. by Convener Ron Sullivan at SAWPA, 11615 Sterling Avenue, Riverside, CA 92503. Convener Sullivan asked the Steering Committee members as well as the members of the public to introduce themselves (see above list).

OWOW 2.0 Workshop

The Committee convened into the OWOW 2.0 Workshop at 3:24 p.m. Jeff Beehler reviewed the history of OWOW 1.0, and moving forward into OWOW 2.0. Celeste Cantú discussed the funding resources to support the next phase implementation – OWOW 2.0. Under OWOW 1.0, a "dream team" was created to think big; under OWOW 2.0, the master craftsmen are being tasked to do that as well. She introduced them: Jerry King (land use emphasis), Richard Meyerhoff (stormwater emphasis), and Wyatt Troxel (wastewater emphasis). At the end of this year, these three master craftsmen will come back with a "big picture" report to be presented to the Steering Committee at their November 2011 meeting. In OWOW 1.0, ten Pillars were appointed; however, in OWOW 2.0, co-chairs have been appointed to newly renamed ten Pillar groups to order to lighten the workloads.

Discussion ensued regarding the master craftsmen's efforts and truly "out of the box" thinking. Some comments received of the Steering Committee were as follows: revisit lost opportunities, do projects that all are interconnected and sustainable; water agencies need to run their business as a business, education is incredibility important, reach across the watershed, keep political will out of the way, get people to think "holistically", push education, creativity, and maximize relationships as "water" connects us all. Other thoughts included watershed trading, connecting the dots regarding acid rain going into the water table, perchlorate, and salt trading. The workshop was adjourned at 3:25 p.m., and the meeting reconvened at 3:57 p.m.

Governance Document (SC #0008)

Celeste Cantú reviewed the suggested revisions as proposed to the Governance Document incorporating two significant changes of adding two co-chairs to each Pillar group and renaming the ten Pillar categories.
